When A Setback Isn't Your Fault | Acts 27:1-44



“But striking a reef where two seas met, they ran the vessel aground; and the prow stuck fast and remained immovable, but the stern began to be broken up by the force of the waves.” – Acts 27:41

Regardless of your circumstances, the presence of God is everywhere, His purpose for your life doesn't change, and God's promises never fail.

What causes people to make poor choices that lead to setbacks and storms?

- When we listen to ungodly advise. (Acts 27:9-10; Acts 27:11)
- When we copy the crowd. (Acts 27:12)
- When we rely on circumstances. (Acts 27:13; Acts 27:14)

What do I need to know about storms?

1. Storms can cause me to drift from my goal. (Acts 27:15; Acts 27:17)
2. Storms can cause me to discard what I value. (Acts 27:18-19)
3. Storms can cause me to despair. (Acts 27:20)

What should I remember when it feels hopeless? How Can I Anchor My Life in a Storm?

FIRST ANCHOR:

- Remember God's is with me, He hasn't left me. (Acts 27:21-23)

SECOND ANCHOR:

- Remember God's purpose is greater than my setbacks. (Acts 27:24)

THIRD ANCHOR:

- Remember God's promises can be trusted. (Acts 27:25-26; Acts 27:30-32; Acts 27:34-36; Acts 27:43-44)
