When A Setback Fills You With Fear



There are no comebacks without setbacks. Every setback is a setup or a comeback. A setback is intended not to punish me, but to prepare me for my next stage of responsibility.

Common Fears at the Birth of Jesus

- Mary faced the fear of inadequacy. (Luke 1:29-34)
- Joseph faced the fear of disapproval. (Matthew 1:18-20)
- Shepherds faced the fear of unexpected change. (Luke 2:8-10)
- King Herod faced the fear of losing control. (Matthew 2:1-3)
- Zachariah faced the fear of being disappointed. (Luke 1:11-13)

How can I replace my fears with faith?

1. Surrender my life completely to God every day. (Luke 1:38; Job 11:13-18)
2. Stop listening to the voices of fear. (Romans 14:23)
3. Fill my mind with music that praises God. (Luke 1:46-56)
4. Base my hope on the promise of God. (Luke 1:45; Psalm 56:3-4)
